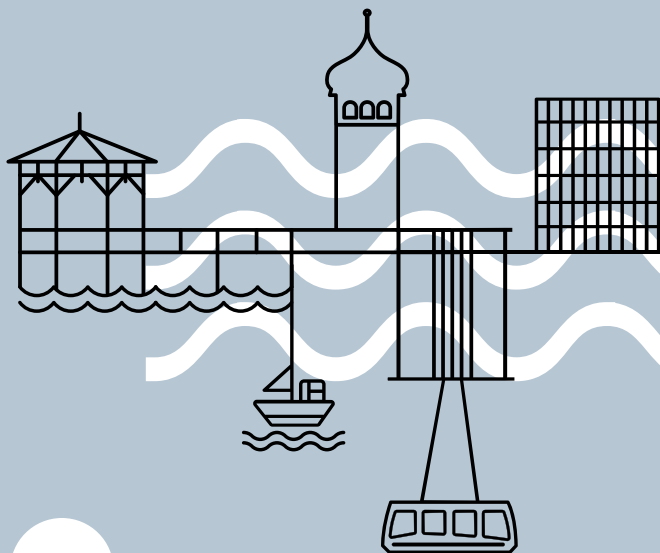

BREGENZER THROUGH THE AGES



circa 1500 BC

Earliest finds on the site of present-day Bregenz

15 BC

Alpine region conquered by the Romans; urban settlement on the Ölrain

Founding of the city of Bregenz on a plateau of the upper town by the Counts of Montfort; the nucleus of modern day Bregenz

1451 and 1523

Bregenz becomes Austrian

1650

Founding of the corn market

1726 - 1786

Bregenz becomes the administrative centre of Vorarlberg

1805 - 1814

Vorarlberg belongs to the Kingdom of Bavaria; administrative reform, granting of certain fundamental civil rights; 1806 Dissolution of Mehrerau Abbey

1870-1872

Construction of the Vorarlberg Railway: Line from Bregenz to Bludenz and connection to the German and Swiss railway network

1884

Launch of the Austrian Lake Constance Shipping Service

1923

The new state constitution enshrines Bregenz as the official capital of the state.

1927

Construction of the cable car on the Pfänder

1946

Founding of the Bregenz Festspiele (Bregenz Festival)

1977

Opening of the first pedestrian zone in Vorarlberg on Kaiserstraße

1997

Opening of Kunsthaus Bregenz (KUB)

2009 - 2013

Construction of new building and redesign of vorarlberg museum

Opening of the new pedestrian zone & Pipeline

OBERSTADT (UPPER TOWN) BREGENZ



Martin Sturm (St. Martin's Tower)

Martinsgasse 3b

Built in 1601, the tower is considered to be the first baroque building in the Lake Constance area and has the largest bulb-shaped dome in Central Europe. The Bregenz landmark is open from May to October, offering both a wonderful panoramic view and an exhibition on the city's history.

Deuring Schlössle

Ehre-Guta-Platz 4

On the edge of Ehre-Guta-Platz, there is a building that characterises the upper town. For 150 years, it was owned by the Vorarlberg noble family, Deuring. It is now privately owned and can only be viewed from the outside.

Altes Rathaus (Old Town Hall)

Graf-Wilhelm-Straße 14

Between Graf-Wilhelm- and Eponastraße, you will find the largest half-timbered building in the city. Built in 1662, it was the administrative centre of Bregenz until the 19th century. It is now a residential building.

Ehre-Guta-Platz

The name dates back to an old legend: In the 15th century, an old woman named Guta learned of an imminent attack by the Appenzellers. She immediately warned the people of Bregenz, allowing them to fend off the attack.

The history of the cultural city by Lake Constance can be explored through certain buildings, stories and anecdotes.

By taking a stroll through Bregenz, you can immerse yourself in the city's fascinating past, discover hidden treasures and learn more about the cultural development and significant events that have shaped Bregenz.

General City Tour

For all those who want to know more about the gem between the mountain and the lake. The small city in the border triangle on the shores of Lake Constance has more to offer than just wonderful scenery. It amazes people with contemporary architecture, a wide range of cultural and culinary experiences, a dreamy old town and, of course, the world-famous Bregenzer Festspiele. Those participating in the tour can look forward to plenty of background information, anecdotes and interesting stories.

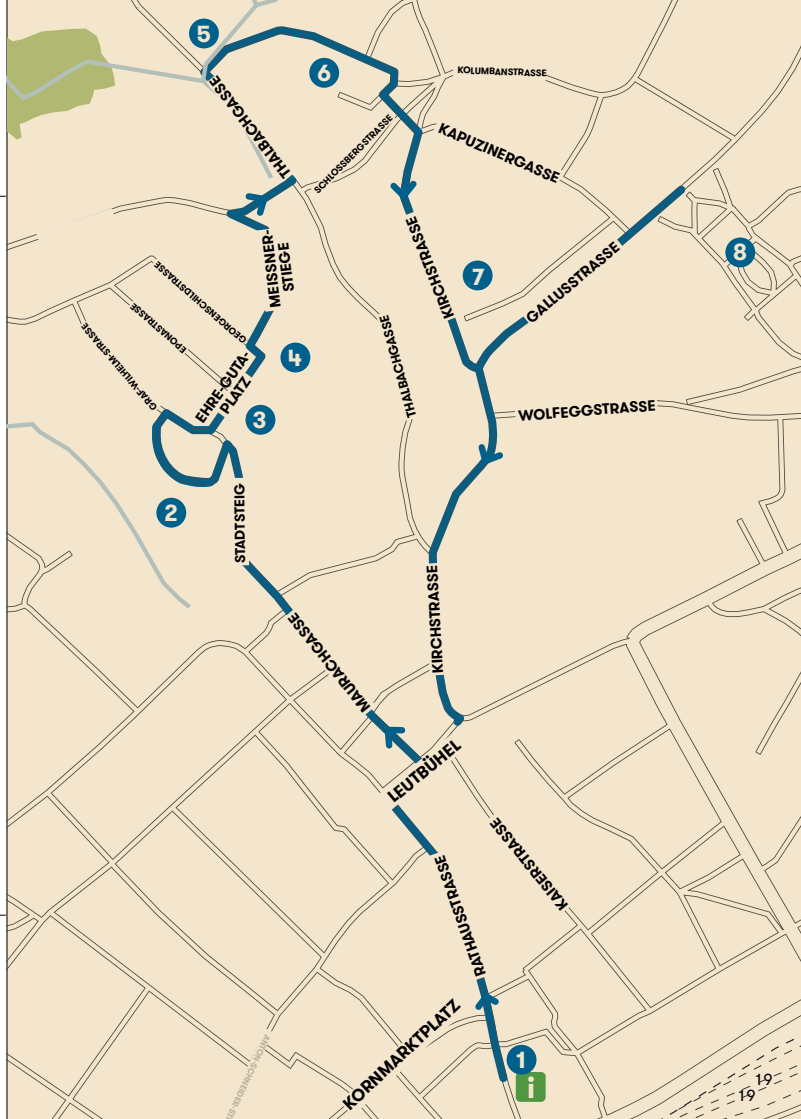
DISCOVERY TRAIL



The approximately one-hour walk covering the history of the city of Bregenz begins at the **Bregenz Tourismus & Stadtmarketing office** at Rathausstraße 35a ❶. Head across Leutbühelplatz and along Maurachgasse towards Oberstadt (upper town). Here you can see **Martinsturm and Martinskapelle** ❷ with its impressive bulb-shaped dome. Continuing past the medieval walls, the route leads you down cobbled alleys to **Ehre-Guta-Platz** ❸ and the **Deuring Schlössle** ❹. Leave the old town via the Meißnerstiege steps. **Kloster Thalbach (Thalbach Monastery)** ❺ and the **Stadtpfarrkirche St. Gallus (Parish Church of St. Gallus)** ❻ are the next stops, connected by the Ernst-Volkman-Stiege steps. Once at the top, enjoy the view of the striking corner tower of the Deuring Schlössle. From the **Kapuzinerkloster (Capuchin Monastery)** ❼, it is just a short walk along Gallusstraße to the **Thurn-und-Taxis-Park** ❸, which is protected due to its impressive collection of trees and rare plants. The magnificent palace in front of the park is home to works of art from the Berufsvereinigung Bildender Künstlerinnen und Künstler Vorarlbergs. Kirchstraße, with its charming little shops, is the final stop on the way back to Leutbühel.

Insider's tip - selfie spot

You can find the narrowest house in Europe at Kirchstraße 29.



CHURCHES, CHAPELS & MONASTERIES



Stadtpfarrkirche St. Gallus (Parish Church of St. Gallus)

Kirchplatz 3

The name of the church can be traced back to the Irish monk, Saint Gallus, who came to Bregenz as a missionary in the year 610. The parish church, the oldest in the Vorarlberg lowlands, was first documented at the end of the 11th century. Inside the church, you can find magnificent stucco and paintings. The silver altar in the left chapel is one of the most important baroque works of art in Vorarlberg.

Herz-Jesu-Kirche (Church of the Sacred Heart)

Kolpingplatz 1

The 62-metre tall brick towers can be seen for miles. Remarkably, the construction of the neo-Gothic style church (1905 to 1908) was financed almost entirely by donations from the people of Bregenz.

Kloster Thalbach (Thalbach Monastery)

Thalbachgasse 10

Kloster Thalbach – in its present form – was built in 1675 by the baroque architects Michael Thumb from Bezau and Michael Kuen from Bregenz. As a spiritual centre, it is known far beyond the borders of the Diocese of Feldkirch.

Kloster Mehrerau (Mehrerau Abbey)

Mehrerauerstraße 66

Located just a stone's throw from Lake Constance, this is where the monks of the Cistercian abbey, Wettingen-Mehrererau, live and work. Group tours of the abbey can be arranged in advance.

ART & CULTURE

Bregenz is not just known for Lake Constance. It also boasts a wealth of art and cultural institutions. With its small galleries, the international Kunsthaus, modern museums and medieval buildings – Bregenz never ceases to amaze.





BREGENZER FESTSPIELE **BREGENZ FESTIVAL**

Every summer, the Bregenz Festspiele presents high-quality open-air operas on the lake.

Every two years, the spectacular new stage designs attract international attention. The extensive and varied programme also includes ambitious productions and premieres at the Festspielhaus and on the Werkstattbühne. A total of 200,000 visitors are captivated by the festival every year.

The festival began in 1946 when it was known as 'Bregenz Festwoche' (Bregenz Festival Week). The Vienna Symphony Orchestra has been a permanent fixture at the summer lakeside festival ever since and is a favourite of the international audience. A touch of Hollywood has been felt around the festival grounds ever since Daniel Craig pursued villains across the Seebühne (floating stage) as 007 in the film, 'A Quantum of Solace'.

Bregenzer Festspiele & Seebühne (Floating Stage)

The performances on the world's biggest floating stage promise memorable open-air (opera) moments.



Fischersteg (Fishing Pier)

When it was built in 1902, the pier was originally intended for anglers, but twenty years later it became a take-off area for seaplanes. It now serves as a bar in the summer months.



Bregenz Harbour

The home port of Vorarlberg Lines and for many day-trippers it's the gateway to Bregenz with dining options and good connections to the city centre and the Pfänderbahn cable car. Numerous excursion boats and liner vessels depart from the harbour. Particularly eye-catching: the harbour building 'Die Welle' and the 'Sonnenkönigin', an exclusive ship for special occasions.



Sunsetstufen, Molo (Sunset Steps)

A popular meeting point and a great place to watch the sun sink into Lake Constance. During the day, visitors dip their feet into the water and enjoy the view of the floating stage.

Pipeline

A paradise for locals and visitors alike. The Pipeline in Bregenz shows how a region can thrive through innovation and engagement. Visit this picturesque spot to experience the beauty of the lake, whether on a romantic sunset walk or a fun bike ride along the shore.



LAKE ACTIVITIES



Cycling

Whether a leisurely excursion or a challenging tour, the well-designed Lake Constance Cycle Path offers plenty of options. One popular route goes from Bregenz to Friedrichshafen via Lindau. The 36-kilometre journey takes around two and a half hours.

Running

Joggers and Nordic walkers head out and enjoy the view of the lake and it's the perfect place to cool off afterwards. One of many possible routes starts at the indoor swimming pool (Hallenbad), it continues along the shore past the harbour and the Mili to Strandbad Lochau (a lakeside beach) and back to the starting point. (approx. 7 kilometres).

Boat Rides

Pedalos and electric boats offer a unique perspective of the bay of Bregenz and lots of fun for up to six people on the shimmering waters of Lake Constance. Cindy Feurstein has various models available for hire at her location in Gondelhafen between the Fischersteg pier and Festspielhaus.

Mini golf

The mini golf course is located on the promenade next to the floating stage (Seebühne) and Festspielhaus Bregenz. It is the perfect place to enjoy both mini golf and Lake Constance at the same time.

Fishing

Bregenz has some great fishing spots on Lake Constance. Fishing licences are available from Bregenz Tourismus at Rathausstraße 35a.

Stand-up Paddleboarding

Stand-up paddleboarding (SUP) is easy to learn. Anyone who wants to give the sport a try can hire equipment or book a course at Strandbad Bregenz (outdoor pool) or Ländle SUP at Kaiserstrand Lochau.

Sailing

Sporthafen Bregenz, situated approx. 500 metres west of the Strandbad, is the perfect spot for sailors. The guest dock with mooring facilities has space for 30 guest boats.

A UNIQUE PANORAMIC VIEW OF LAKE CONSTANCE

The view of the 240 Alpine peaks in Austria, Germany and Switzerland makes the Pfänder the most popular vantage point in the entire Lake Constance region.

The Pfänder, Bregenz's local mountain, offers residents and visitors a wide range of options for sustainable outdoor experiences. One big advantage is that it is extremely easy to get to. The harbour and the harbour railway station (Bregenz Hafen) are just a seven-minute walk away. Departing from the base station, the Pfänderbahn cable car climbs 600 metres in just six minutes. At an altitude of 1,064 metres, the summit offers sweeping views of the deep blue waters of Lake Constance, the towns and villages along its shore, and the Austrian and Swiss mountains – a wholesome experience. A trip to the Pfänder is always worthwhile.

EVENTS & MARKETS IN BREGENZ

Events and Festivals

Annual events help to create a rich and varied programme in Bregenz. The three-day 'BREGENZ LIFE' open-air festival held on the Kornmarktplatz is a musical highlight. The event series 'Die Lange Nacht der Musik' (The Long Night of Music) brings live music to the pubs and bars of Bregenz all year round. 'Hafenfest' (Harbour Festival) and the 'Stadt der Kinder' (City of Children) round off the summer of events. The event year ends with a festive flourish, as the first Christmas Markets open on Leutbühel and the Kornmarktplatz in mid-November.

Markets

The region around Lake Constance provides optimal conditions for sustainable, organic farming and this makes for a great selection of products at Bregenz's weekly market, which is held every Tuesday and Friday morning. In addition, local farmers offer seasonal produce on Kaiserstraße every Friday. Leutbühel becomes a marketplace every Saturday and on Wednesdays from May to October. Themed markets are also held throughout the year.

BREGENZ WITH KIDS



Bregenz has a wide range of exciting excursion spots for the whole family. Hiking, bike rides, and activities both in and around Lake Constance make the trip to Bregenz a special experience.

Museums

Both the vorarlberg museum and Kunsthaus Bregenz offer creative workshops for children almost every Saturday. There are also tours specifically for families. Free admission for children and young people aged 19 and under.

Playgrounds

Highlights at the playground on the promenade opposite the casino include a zip line and a locomotive. Walk five minutes in the direction of the harbour and you'll reach the next playground by the ice cream parlour. The Weiher-spielplatz playground is located close to the Ibis hotel. There is a spacious, well-shaded playground next to the Bundesdenkmalamt (Federal Monuments Authority) building in Oberstadt.

Please note: There are some steep sections that are difficult for prams.

Mini golf

The mini golf course is located on the promenade next to the floating stage (Seebühne) and Festspielhaus Bregenz. It is the perfect place to enjoy both mini golf and Lake Constance at the same time.

While parents enjoy the view from the mountain station, the kids can play on the slides, climbing frames and swings. A bungee trampoline is available in the summer. You can visit local animals, such as Alpine ibexes, deer, mouflons and wild boars, for free at the Alpine Wildlife Park.
